As the City of Sciences in Tunis has the noble mission of disseminating the scientific and technological culture, and in accordance with its scientific program elaborated for the year 2023, the City of Sciences in Tunis (CST) has programmed to organize guided visits to the Botanical Garden of Tunis during Fridays at 2.30 pm. The point of departure will be from the reception desk of the CST.

These visits enable the visitors to discover the plant collection of the botanical garden of Tunis which is a real place of learning and dissemination of scientific culture, including biodiversity and nature conservation. It counts 80% of trees and shrubs including exotic species coming from several countries of the world such as Australia, South America, South Africa, the Canary Islands and the Mediterranean. The garden contains several plant subdivisions, including the palm grove (Phoenix, Canariensis, etc.), the horticultural collection (Ficus, Mélias, Cercis), the geographical collection (Eucalyptus and Casuarina), the botanical collection (Acacia, Gleditschia, etc.), the experimental plots (Argan trees, etc.) and the collection of various trees. It is worth to note that guided tours to the botanical garden of Tunis can take place with a previous reservation from Wednesday to Friday.

In terms of the site's choice of the Tunis Science City, the Botanical Garden of Tunis is considered as the second pillar after that of the archaeological basin of Abu Fehr. It is also part of its architectural project and is included in its scientific programme as a complementary area to the pavilion of "Life and Man". It is accessible thanks to a 600m long footbridge, called "Bridge of Knowledge", which connects the Planetarium to the Botanical Garden and allows visitors to access easily.
